Halloween Cat Safety Checklist

Halloween is fun for people, but it can be stressful—or even dangerous—for cats.

Use this checklist to keep your feline family safe during the holiday.

Candy & Food Safety

- Keep all candy (especially chocolate and sugar-free treats with xylitol which are highliy toxic to cats) out of reach.
- Dispose of candy wrappers immediately to prevent choking or blockages.
- Remind kids and guests never to share candy with pets.
- Call your vet or the ASPCA Poison Control Hotline if ingestion is suspected.

Costumes & Decorations

- Avoid dressing cats in costumes—they restrict movement and increase stress.
- Choose safe, festive alternatives like themed collars or bandanas.
- Keep candles, jack-o'-lanterns, and incense out of reach to prevent burns or fires.
- Avoid tinsel, fake cobwebs, and glow sticks—these can be harmful if chewed.

Indoor Cat Safety

- Set up a quiet safe room with food, water, litter, and cozy bedding.
- Use soft music or white noise to mask doorbell sounds
- Keep cats away from frequently opening doors to prevent escapes.
- Consider pheromone diffusers to ease anxiety.

Outdoor & Community Cat Care

- Provide hidden, insulated shelters away from busy sidewalks.
- Feed colonies before dark to limit exposure during peak activity.
- Avoid drawing attention to colony areas with decorations or visible feeding stations.
- Check shelters the day after Halloween for disturbances.
